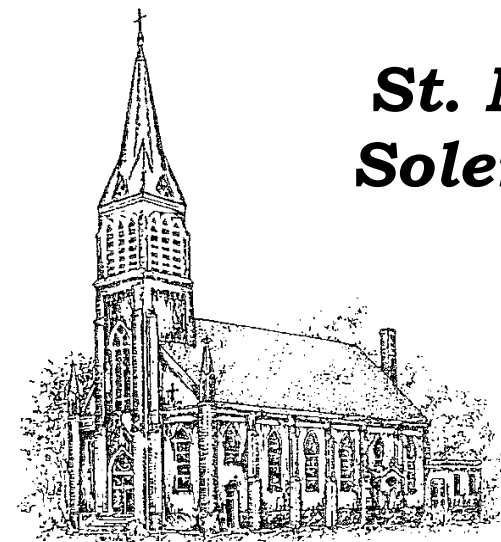

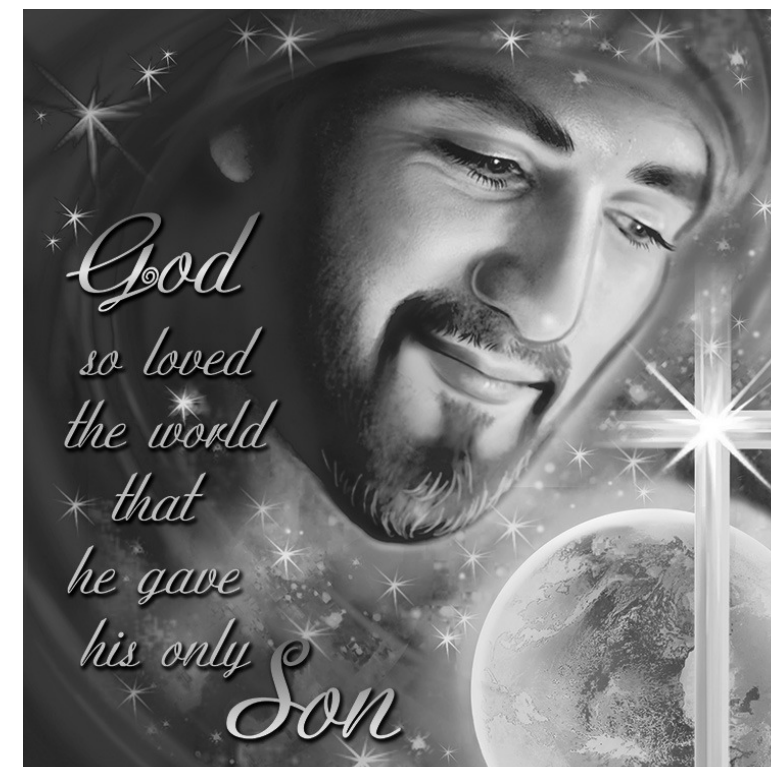



THE JULY 4TH AND LABOR DAY PICNICS have been an important social and fundraising event in our parish for many years. They date back, approximately 145 years, to the establishment of St. Florian and St. Michael's Church

around 1872. The first picnics were not on church grounds, but on the nearby Matthew and Henry Stumpe property near a year-round spring. There were games, dances with portable dance floors, homemade ice cream and lemonade, bbq and chicken stew. It was a truly social outing for the parish, the community, and the surrounding area, one of the first of its kind in north Alabama. In the beginning, some people rode for hours in their horse-drawn buggies to come back home for a St. Michael's Picnic. Now held on church picnic grounds behind the school building, the cooking begins on July 3 around 6am and continues throughout the night until sales begin on July 4, around 6am. Truly a fete of cooperation and fellowship, parish and friend volunteers plan and organize the event and come together to "make happen" the bbq, chicken stew, bbq sauce, bingo games, a summer raffle, children's games, bake sale, potato peeling, meals for workers... The picnics over the years have been chaired by the Altar Society, Parents Organization, Parish Council, and many pairs of married couples and singles. This year, Steve Kirkpatrick has kindly agreed to chair the summer picnics. Please give him your help and support as he undertakes this task.
